


DEAR JASON SLEEP,

AFTER WE HAD THAT SESSION WITH YOU, I GOT ON THE BUS AND COULDN'T HELP THINKING ABOUT MY DAD WHEN I GOT HOME THE FIRST THING I DID WAS CALL MY DAD, I TOLD HIM ALL ABOUT HOW YOU SURVIVED THE ACCIDENT AND HOW YOU ARE IN A WHEELCHAIR. MY DAD WAS QUITE INTERESTED TO HEAR ABOUT THIS. I ALSO TOLD MY DAD AT HOW I THINK HE SHOULD START DOING SOMETHING LIKE THIS, ABOUT 4 DAYS AGO I RECEIVED A LETTER FROM MY DAD ALONG WITH A FLYER ATTACHED, AND THE FLYER WAS OF A WHEELCHAIR BASKETBALL TEAM IN LAUNCESTON. TO MY SURPRISE MY DAD WAS ON THE FRONT I WAS SO PROUD AND THANKS TO YOU HE NOW FEELS ALLOT BETTER ABOUT BEING IN A WHEELCHAIR. SO I THANK YOU FOR GIVING ME THIS OPPORTUNITY TO EXPERIENCE WHAT IT IS LIKE FOR MANY PEOPLE AND WITHOUT YOU I AM NOT SURE WHAT OR WHERE MY DAD WOULD BE NOW. THANKS.
